THE ARMOR OF GOD - THE HELMET OF SALVATION

“But let us, who are of the day, be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love; and for an helmet, the hope of salvation.” (1 Thessalonians 5:8)

The Armor of the Roman Soldier

It can be easily argued that the Romans had the finest head protection of the day. Some of the helmets used by other nations were made of cloth or animal hides and others were made of animal bones, hooves or other “hard” materials.

The Roman helmet could have been made of cast bronze for soldiers and/or an iron alloy for officers. These helmets were normally lined with softened leather to provide comfort and a good fit. Such helmets included chin straps to further

secure the head protection, as well as a visor. They also extended down to cover the back and sides of the neck; thus giving protection to sensitive attack points.

These helmets often included a ridge on top so that some type of plume or brush could be attached to identify an officer's rank. High ranking officers often had gold and/or silver alloy helmets for parades and ceremonies.

Spiritual Applications

Obviously, a well-designed, perfectly fitted, helmet is critical in warfare. It is the same in spiritual warfare.

Our minds present an area of great struggle. The enemy uses logic, secular wisdom, emotions, doubts, etc. to sway our convictions away from God's Word. We need a well grounded understanding of our salvation to keep our minds protected.

“How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation; which at the first began to be spo-

*ken by the Lord, and was confirmed unto us by them that heard him;”
(Hebrews 2:3)*

The author of Hebrews stresses the importance of giving heed to our salvation. He says to believers, “How shall we escape...” This is spiritual warfare.

It is critical to dig into the Bible to strengthen our helmet with the truth of our great salvation. There is more to it than a one-time prayer.

“But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived. (14) But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; (15) And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. (16) All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: (17) That the man of God may be perfect, thor-
